- Perform an E/M (99213)
- Perform Debridement (CPT 11042)
- Documentation: Diagnosis Code, Procedural Code, Number of Wound(s), Wound Type (Location, Stage, Full- or Partial-Thickness), Wound Measurements (L x W x D), Type and Amount of Drainage, and Prescription for Primary/Secondary Dressing(s) including: Frequency and Duration of Dressing Changes and Written Instructions

NON-DISPENSING DOCTOR

▶ Step 1 - Completes and Signs Rx for Fulfillment at Pharmacy

- Was prescription filled?
- Did Patient receive high-quality wound care supplies or generic of unknown quality?
- Did patient understand how to properly apply the product?
- Was Patient compliant?

▶ Step 2 - Billing Protocol

Bills Medicare for office procedures \$194.76*

TOTAL REVENUE: \$194.76*

DME DISPENSING DOCTOR
